and

NEGROS ORIENTAL STATE UNIVERSITY (NORSU), in Dumaguete City, Philippines created under the Republic Act 9299 on June 25, 2004, whose main office address at Dumaguete City, represented by its President **Joel P. Limson, Ph. D.**, hereinafter referred to as **NORSU**.

The **COLLEGE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE EDUCATION**, with office address at NORSU-Main Campus 2, Barangay Bajumpandan, Dumaguete City, Philippines hereinafter represented by its Dean **Jose Rene A. Cepe, Ph.D.** hereinafter referred to as the **NORSU-CCJE**.

NORSU and Barangay Puhagan are hereinafter referred to individually as "**Party**" and collectively as "**Parties**".

WHEREAS,

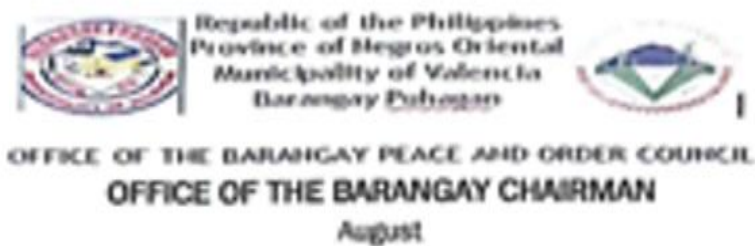
- A) **Barangay Puhagan** is a barangay in the municipality of Valencia, Negros Oriental. As of FY 2010 the annual internal revenue allotment is 1,023,740.00 with over 2,000 that represents 5.16% of the total population of Valencia. The barangay has Geothermal Power Station operated by the Energy Development Corporation that supplies the power needs of 8 provinces in Negros, Panay, Guimaras and Cebu Islands. Under R.A. 7160, the barangay serves as the implementing unit of government policies, plans, programs, projects, and activities in the community (provision of basic health at the community level; peace and order; dispute resolution; among others).
- B) **Negros Oriental State University** is mandated to provide advanced education, higher technological, professional instruction and training in the fields of arts, sciences, education, commerce, agriculture and forestry, and fishery and other related fields of study. It shall also promote research and extension services and provide progressive leadership in its areas of specialization (Republic Act 9299).
- C) **NORSU - College of Criminal Justice Education** provides quality instruction and effective training that will develop a progressive education for those who are deserving and to keep abreast with the changing times and apply latest technology and modern techniques in Law Enforcement, Criminal Justice System, Public Safety Administration, Corrections and Jail Management.

NOW, THEREFORE, in recognition of their common interests and objectives, and in order to supplement and strengthen the existing understandings amongst the Parties with respect to cooperation in community development, the Parties confirm their mutual understanding on the following:

Objective of the Extension Project	<p>The Project shall be conducted in the Puhagan Barangay Hall starting from June 2019 and will end in July 2019. The training on Water Safety and Rescue shall be held at the Puhagan Cold Spring. Each activity shall have a duration of 32 hours, done during Saturdays and Sundays only. Water Safety and Rescue trainings shall be given to 70 Barangay Officials and Tanods, while the lectures on Drugs Education and on Crime Monitoring are given to 50 Barangay Residents representing the different paroks. With this project, it is expected that there will be considerable improvement in Crime Monitoring system in the barangay. The Barangay officials and the tanods – considered as force multipliers by the PNP – shall also be in greater shape in carrying out law enforcement and crime control tasks within the different paroks of the barangay. Aside from this, the residents of Barangay Puhagan is also expected to adopt a more heightened awareness and improved skills in survival and rescue in times of inundation, especially with the fact that the barangay is one of the most devastated areas by floods that hit the province brought by Typhoons Sendong, and Pablo. Ultimately, this project is expected to reduce crime occurrence and control illegal drug proliferation in the barangay. It shall also improve the disaster resilience of the barangay, especially during strong typhoons where inundation is very possible.</p>

Terminal Report: Community Extension Program in Barangay Puhagan, Valencia, Negros Oriental

This Terminal Report details the successful implementation of the **Community Crime Prevention and Control Program** in Barangay Puhagan, Valencia, Negros Oriental. The core objective of this extension initiative was to proactively address the underlying causes of crime and bolster community preparedness against both criminal activity and natural disasters. This was achieved by equipping local safety officers and community members with essential knowledge and practical skills necessary for effective crime prevention, control, and response. The project represents a significant commitment by the College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE) to fulfill its mandate of public service and community engagement.

The College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE), in collaboration with the Office of Research Extension and International Linkages (REXIL) of Negros Oriental State University (NORSU), launched this vital Community Extension Program. The formal commencement and launching date of the project was marked by the signing of a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between NORSU CCJE and Barangay Puhagan on August 30, 2019. This agreement solidified the partnership and paved the way for the scheduled activities. While the initial planning phase involved Barangay Palinpinon, the focused implementation and completion were successfully carried out in Barangay Puhagan, underscoring the adaptability and commitment of the CCJE team.

The program's delivery methodology was designed to maximize community participation, primarily targeting Barangay Public Safety Officers (BPSO), Barangay Crime Watch volunteers, and Barangay Auxiliary Police (BAP). Recognizing that most participants had weekday commitments, all training services, which included lectures and actual demonstrations, were conveniently scheduled and rendered exclusively on **Sundays**. This strategic scheduling ensured a high attendance rate and greater absorption of the training material by the barangay personnel who are critical to local peace and order.

The content of the extension program was multifaceted and tailored to meet the dual challenges of crime and disaster management. The curriculum focused heavily on Community Crime/Disaster Prevention and Control, delivered through expert lectures facilitated by CCJE Faculty Trainors. A key component of the input activities involved a blended approach: mornings were dedicated to theoretical lectures, while the afternoons shifted to practical, hands-on sessions. These afternoon demonstrations included crucial training in **Self-Defense** techniques, specifically for the Barangay Tanod, BPSO, and BAP participants, ensuring they were physically prepared to handle potentially volatile situations.

Furthermore, the program strategically involved Student Interns (OJT students) from the College of Criminal Justice Education. These students played a critical supporting role, assisting the professional lecturers and facilitating the actual practical training sessions for the barangay safety



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personnel. This involvement provided the student interns with invaluable real-world experience in community outreach, practical criminology, and public safety instruction, thereby serving as a valuable component of their professional development while simultaneously enhancing the quality and scale of the services delivered to the community.

The College's motivation for conducting this extension program goes beyond mere academic outreach; it is firmly rooted in national policy and social responsibility. The initiative aligns directly with the administration's focus on **promoting Social Security, Peace, and Strong Institutions**, as outlined in President Rodrigo Duterte's 10-point Socio-Economic Agenda. By bolstering the capabilities of local safety forces, the College effectively supports the efforts of the local police and contributes to overall community resilience and stability.

Finally, the College took a proactive stance in disaster preparedness by integrating modules on water safety and rescue. This initiative was conducted in direct implementation of the provisions of **Republic Act 10121**, also known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010. By complementing state programs with targeted training, the CCJE reinforced the barangay's capacity for disaster resilience and response. The entire extension program for Barangay Puhagan, Valencia, was successfully completed within the month of December 2019, signifying a major accomplishment in the College's commitment to community welfare

Terminal Report (Barangay Palinpinon, Valencia, Negros Oriental)

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Despite the significant increase of crime committed in recent years, most of the responsibility for crime control rests at the National and local levels of government. The national and local governments do most of the criminal justice work and spend most of the criminal justice agencies specifically the law enforcement agencies such as PNP, NBI, PDEA and others. Additionally, A key role of the Institution like the College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE) of Negros Oriental State University (NORSU), by its faculty commits to community involvement that is to provide leadership and support to these efforts in order to further develop the local or barangay capacity to prevent and control crime and administer justice fairly and effectively. The essence of community crime prevention and control program was to address the causes of crime and apprehending the suspected law violators.

The College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE) with the Office of Research Extension and International Linkages (REXIL) through the office of the Extension Director of Negros Oriental State University (NORSU) conducted a Community Extension Program at Barangay Palinpinon, Valencia just completed last May 22, 2022. The services rendered by the College was in a form of lectures and actual demonstration/martial arts training during SUNDAYS only considering that most of the participants are available only within that day. These lectures on Community Crime/Disaster Prevention and Control as delivered by CCJE Faculty would seek to educate the barangay through their Barangay Public Safety Officers (BPSO) and among others who are interested to receive our extension program. Moreover, it is also designed to help them in coping up the problem of crimes and natural disasters and calamities.

With this, last February 17, 2022 (Thursday) was the MOA signing and Launching of the Extension Program between the College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE) spearheaded by Dean, Jose Rene A. Cepe, together with REXIL through the office of Extension Director of Negros Oriental State University and Barangay Palinpinon Valencia, represented by their Barangay Captain Carlos Gainzan, Councilors and BPSO as the main participants of the said extension activity.

The extension program for Barangay Palinpinon, Valencia by its input of activities is just a duplicate of what has been provided in Barangay Puhagan of the same locality initiated last 2019. The formal sequence of activity, there will be lectures in the morning to be facilitated by CCJE Trainors/Lecturers then in the afternoon is the actual demonstration in Self-Defense for our BPSO participants. In the same manner, some Intern or OJT students from the



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College are involved to assist the Professional Lecturers and in the actual training of the said mentioned participants.

Moreover, the college felt the need to conduct this extension program aside from helping our local police in adherence to Former President Rodrigo Duterte's 10-point Socio-Economic Agenda that includes the promotion of Social Security. Likewise, the College makes its own initiative in the implementation of the provisions of RA 101211, otherwise known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010 by conducting Water Safety and Rescue Training to compliment the state's programs geared towards making the barangay disaster resilient.

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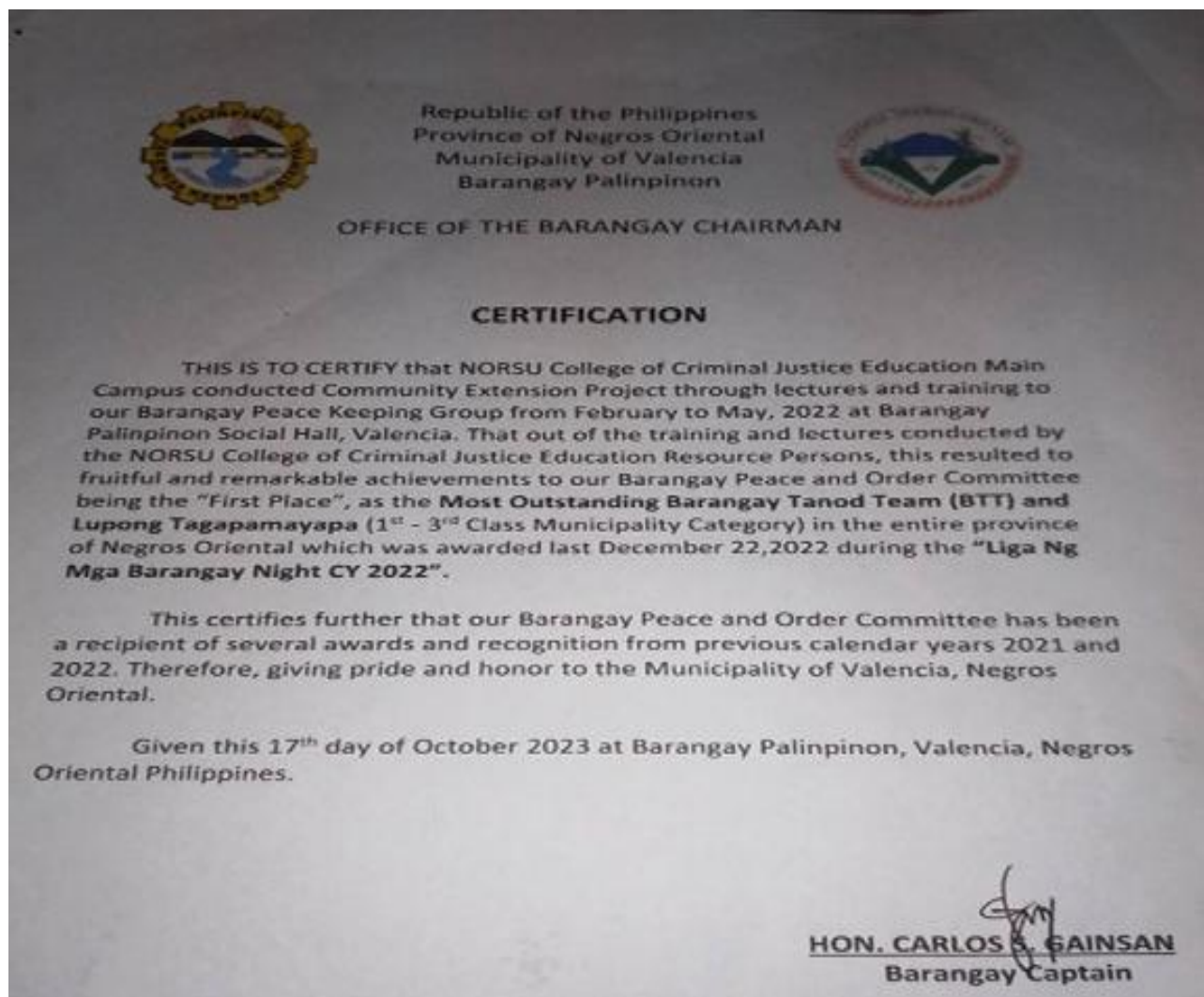


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Awards of Distinction and Achievement and Grants of this Program
