

II. RATIONALE

(Provides a situationer or conditions that justifies the project)

Liptong is a barangay in the municipality of Valencia, in the province of Negros Oriental. Its population as determined by the 2020 Census was 1,224. This represented 3.16% of the total population of Valencia. The household population of Liptong in the 2015 census was 1,193 broken down into 272 households or an average of 4.39 members per household. According to the 2015 Census, the age group with the highest population in Liptong is 20 to 24, with 127 individuals. Conversely, the age group with the lowest population is 80 and over, with 15 individuals.

Combining age groups together, those aged 14 and below, consisting of the young dependent population which include infants/babies, children and young adolescents/teenagers, make up an aggregate of 25.73% (307). Those aged 15 up to 64, roughly, the economically active population and actual or potential members of the work force, constitute a total of 67.56% (806). Finally, old dependent population consisting of the senior citizens, those aged 65 and over, total 6.71% (80) in all.

The computed Age Dependency Ratios mean that among the population of Liptong, there are 38 youth dependents to every 100 of the working age population; there are 10 aged/senior citizens to every 100 of the working population; and overall, there are 48 dependents (young and old-age) to every 100 of the working population.

The median age of 28 indicates that half of the entire population of Liptong are aged less than 28 and the other half are over the age of 28

The means of livelihood of the residents is focused on farming since the area is agricultural. A good number of the residents work as laborers as well as providing workforce in Dumaguete City. The mothers are housewives who take care of the needs of the children and the family. Children are mostly educated in a local elementary school. High school age children are enrolled mostly at Valencia National High School in barangay Bong-ao, around four kilometers from Barangay Liptong.

Per consultation with the barangay during our outreach activity last January 21, 2024, not only are the local officials willing to improve their lives in various ways but also the constituents. The request for training comes from them, hence, this proposal is conceived.

The Halad Pagbansay aims to improve the lives of the people living in Barangay Liptong. Specifically, this training intends to

- Develop the skills and livelihood capabilities
- Empower barangay folks on their duties and responsibilities to protect their family and the entire barangay
- Improve individuals through wellness activities, and
- Enhance academic endeavours of struggling learners in varied subjects

IV. BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Halad Pagbansay is basically a training program for interested barrio folks who would like to make a difference in their lives. This involves various aspects, like: skills or livelihood training, strengthening of barangay duties and responsibilities by elected/appointed officials, wellness, as well as academic tutorials for school age learners who are struggling academically.

V. STRATEGIES OF IMPLEMENTATION

A. Partner-beneficiaries

The beneficiary of this Hadlad Pagbansay will be the barrio folks from Barangay Liptong. Valencia, Negros Oriental. This is one of the 24 barangays of Valencia located in the south of the town, near the border between the municipality of Bacong and Valencia. They were the recipients of the newly finished outreach program conducted by the College in January 21, 2024. They were satisfied with the services provided during the outreach and asked for more trainings/engagement from the University. Based on the training needs assessment, varied needed services were identified.

B. Program Management

The program is spearheaded by the College of teacher Education and Graduate Teacher Education Programs, and ably supported by the College of Criminal Justice Education, College of Agriculture and Forestry, and College of Industrial Technology. Project leaders and co-leaders from the different colleges will collaborate in the implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of the program. Strong tie-up with the local barangay officials through the barangay captain will also be done. Pupils with least learned skills identified by the Department of Education through Liptong Elementary School Principal will also be catered in the barangay through the tutorial classes.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) is signed on JUNE 15, 2024

Between

The BARANGAY LIPTONG, with office address at Barangay Liptong, Valencia, Negros Oriental, Philippines hereinafter represented by its Barangay Captain Fernand V. Noay hereinafter referred to as the Barangay Liptong.

and

NEGROS ORIENTAL STATE UNIVERSITY (NORSU), in Dumaguete City, Philippines created under the Republic Act 9299 on June 25, 2004, whose main office address at Dumaguete City, represented by its President Joel P. Limson, Ph. D., hereinafter referred to as NORSU.

NORSU and Barangay Liptong are hereinafter referred to individually as "Party" and collectively as "Parties".

WHEREAS,

A) Barangay Liptong is a barangay in the municipality of Valencia, in the province of Negros Oriental. Its population as determined by the 2020 Census was 1,224. The means of livelihood of the residents is focused on farming since the area is agricultural. A good number of the residents work as laborers as well as providing workforce in Dumaguete City. The mothers are housewives who take care of the needs of the children and the family. Children are mostly educated in a local elementary school. High school age children are enrolled mostly at Valencia National High School in Barangay Bong-ao around 4 kilometers from Barangay Liptong.

Under R.A. 7160, the barangay serves as the implementing unit of government policies, plans, programs, projects, and activities in the community (provision of basic health at the community level; peace and order; dispute resolution; among others).

- B) Negros Oriental State University is mandated to provide advanced education, higher technological, professional instruction and training in the fields of arts, sciences, education, commerce, agriculture and forestry, and fishery and other related fields of study. It shall also promote research and extension services and provide progressive leadership in its areas of specialization (Republic Act 9299).
- C) NORSU College of Teacher Education and Graduate Teacher Education Programs provides quality instruction and effective training that will develop a progressive education for those who are deserving and to keep abreast with the changing times and apply latest technology and modern techniques in curriculum and instruction in all aspects of education as application in varied programs including wellness;
- D) NORSU College of Criminal Justice Education provides quality instruction and effective training that will develop a progressive education for those who are deserving and to keep abreast with the changing times and apply latest

technology and modern techniques in Law Enforcement, Criminal Justice System, Public Safety Administration, Corrections and Jail Management

- E) NORSU College of Industrial Technology and Graduate Programs provides quality instruction and effective training that will develop a progressive education for those who are deserving and to keep abreast with the changing times and apply latest technology and modern techniques in the development of livelihood skills specifically in driving and troubleshooting, electrical house wiring, welding and industrial; arts;
- F) NORSU College of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries and Graduate Programs provides quality instruction and effective training that will develop a progressive education for those who are deserving and to keep abreast with the changing times and apply latest technology and modern techniques in Agriculture specifically in soil plant-based organic agriculture and animal production.

NOW, THEREFORE, in recognition of their common interests and objectives, and in order to supplement and strengthen the existing understandings amongst the Parties with respect to cooperation in community development, the Parties confirm their mutual understanding on the following:

ARTICLE I. PURPOSE

- 1.1 The Purpose of this MOU is to provide skills and professional trainings, knowledge transfer and seminar on Community Crime-Disaster Prevention and Control in order to eliminate or reduce the impacts and risks of hazards through proactive measures taken before an emergency or disaster occurs, enhancement of livelihood skills, literacy, numeracy, sports and wellness, and in the field of agriculture.
- 1.2 The purpose of this MOU is strictly limited to expressing a desire of the Parties for mutual cooperation, and is not intended to impose any legal obligation of any nature on either Party.
- 1.3 This MOU shall not in any manner supersede the existing understandings and other arrangements between the Parties.
- 1.4 "The development and implementation of specific activities based on this MOU shall be separately negotiated and agreed upon in writing by the parties,"

ARTICLE II. SCOPE OF COOPERATION

Within the context of their respective mandates, objectives and procedures, the Parties shall cooperate in the following area:

- Identifying and addressing jointly the Community Crime-Disaster Prevention and Control issues of priority; enhancement of livelihood skills, literacy, numeracy, sports and wellness, and in the field of agriculture.
- Developing and implementing, as appropriate, joint programs and projects in mutually identified areas;
- 3. Organizing workshops, seminars and meetings jointly; and
- Exchanging analytical reports, publications, technical materials, expert services and other information related to the purposes of this MOU.

ARTICLE III. OBJECTIVES

Cooperation and partnership between the Parties under this MOU is based on the overarching mutual recognition of:

- a. The need for long-term approach to inclusive and sustainable Community Crime-Disaster Prevention and Control for Barangay Liptong, Valencia, Negros Oriental;
- b. The need for encouraging full participation of all stakeholders; and
- c. The need for designing, implementing and maintaining result-oriented development policies and programs for Community Crime-Disaster Prevention and Control.

ARTICLE IV. FOCUS OF JOINT ACTIVITIES

With a view to achieving the purposes of the MOU, the Party intend to:

- A. NORSU College of Teacher Education and Graduate Teacher Education Programs provides quality instruction and effective training that will develop a progressive education for those who are deserving and to keep abreast with the changing times and apply latest technology and modern techniques in curriculum and instruction in all aspects of education as application in varied programs including wellness;
- B. NORSU College of Criminal Justice Education provides quality instruction and effective training that will develop a progressive education for those who are deserving and to keep abreast with the changing times and apply latest technology and modern techniques in Law Enforcement, Criminal Justice System, Public Safety Administration, Corrections and Jail Management
- C. NORSU College of Industrial Technology and Graduate Programs provides quality instruction and effective training that will develop a progressive education for those who are deserving and to keep abreast with the changing times and apply latest technology and modern techniques in in the development of livelihood skills specifically in driving and troubleshooting, electrical house wiring, welding and industrial; arts;
- D. NORSU College of Agriculture, Forestry and Graduate Programs provides quality instruction and effective training that will develop a progressive education for those who are deserving and to keep abreast with the changing times and apply latest technology and modern techniques in Agriculture specifically in soil plant-based organic agriculture and animal production.

BARANGAY LIPTONG prepares for the venue, participants and materials needed for the skills and professional trainings, knowledge transfer and seminar.

Parties agree to assist each other in formulating and implementing policies, plans and strategies in the conduct of the Community Crime-Disaster Prevention and Control Training- Workshop; and enhancement of livelihood skills, literacy, numeracy, sports and wellness, and in the field of agriculture.

The Parties therefore intend to invite each other, where appropriate, to meetings, conferences, seminars and workshops relevant to cooperation in the priority areas set out in this MOU.

ARTICLE VII. PERIODIC CONSULTATIONS

The Parties recognize the significance of convening periodic mutual consultations to review the planned, ongoing, implemented, and achieved activities under this MOU, to evaluate the results of such activities and to explore and discuss new challenges, opportunities and problems related to the areas of cooperation under this MOU. It is the understanding of the Parties that such consultations shall be conducted periodically as and when required.

- c. All information obtained and derived from exchange of information either in writing or otherwise shall be treated as confidential during and after the expiration of this MOU unless otherwise mutually agreed upon in writing by the Parties.




VII. DOCUMENTATION




